# **ADVANCING EATING DISORDER CARE IN CANADA: Key Actions from the COVID-19 Costing Study**

On May 2, 2024, a consortium of 40+ partners convened to strategize about next steps from the findings from the Deloitte economic report. Consensus for the urgent need for a national data and monitoring strategy for eating **disorders** was articulated from the meeting.
